The BSTS UK Conference in Brewood, Staffordshire was a great success. About a quarter of our UK members attended the two-day event along with members of The Reverend Phil Moon's welcoming congregation at the beautiful and historic St Mary and St Chad's Church. It was the brain child of Pam and Phil Moon who kindly invited the BSTS to present a mini conference on the back of Pam's two-week Shroud Exhibition. Pam's exhibition enhanced the conference in a unique and powerful way and this beautiful old church was the perfect venue. The BSTS Management Team and all who attended send our heartfelt thanks to Phil and Pam for all their hard work in making this event happen.



The Conference ran for two days and highlighted that, for many, events such as this are the only contact people have with fellow Shroudies so this was an ideal opportunity for our members to come together and get to know each other. It was such a blessing to meet face-to-face with so many of the people we've come to know via email during the past few years. We welcomed many BSTS Members and members of the public from all over the UK, Scotland, Wales, Yorkshire, The Midlands, Merseyside, Derbyshire to name but a few. David Rolfe started the proceedings on Thursday evening with a thought-provoking talk followed by a Q&A. Friday saw Michael Kowalski speak about the C-14 dating. Andrew Willie shared his observations about some of his favourite books in his personal

Shroud library. Michael Woodward spoke of his experience in studying for a postgraduate certificate in Shroud Studies. Pam Moon gave a relatable historical talk on the Ukraine Army of the eleventh century and its significance to the Shroud. Joanne Bywater gave a moving personal testimony whilst Dr Andrew Husselbee, along with Pam Moon, provide their insights into some of the anatomical features and bloodstains visible on the Shroud. Justin Robinson spoke with great authority on the accurate representations of Shroud features that are found on two Byzantine coins from his own personal collection. The event concluded with an update on the BSTS given by David Rolfe, Brenda Benton and Lynne Kowalski before the Right Reverend Canon Bruce Gillingham closed the meeting with a very moving prayer.

Our membership now covers seventeen countries worldwide and we recruited seven new members during the Conference. The event has been filmed and our members will have access to watch these presentations via our 'new' updated website which will be launched soon. The feedback we received on the day was extremely positive and we'd like to thank those of you who emailed in with constructive, supportive feedback.
